



Oklahoma State Board of Registration for Professional Engineers

During the industrial revolution in the 19th century, engineering rose as a profession and was essentially unregulated. Many different societies formed such as ASCE (civil), AIEE (electrical) and ASME (mechanical) to collect and disseminate design knowledge and best practices. The American Society of Heating and Ventilating Engineers (ASHVE), formed in 1894, and The American Society of Refrigerating Engineers (ASRE), formed in 1904, eventually merged to become the ASHRAE we are members of today. Growing industrialization led to a growing number of man-made disasters resulting in loss of life and limb including boiler explosions, machinery accidents and structural collapses. Engineering ethics was either a personal concern for the private engineering practitioner for hire, or a company concern for the employed staff engineer. Societies began to publish formal codes of ethics to which members had to confess or agree in writing as a requirement of membership. They all generally were a vow to protect public welfare by safeguarding life, health, and property. State governments followed up in an effort to protect the public by passing statutes requiring engineers to prove qualifications and be registered as a prerequisite to practice engineering. Our local chapter of ASHRAE was formed in 1935 which happened to be the same year that registration for professional engineers became a thing in the State of Oklahoma.

On May 13, 1935, Oklahoma House Bill 264 of the Fifteenth Oklahoma Legislature passed both Houses and was signed into law by Governor E. W. Marland. It became Section 11, Article 22, Chapter 24 of the Oklahoma Session Laws 1935 and was an Act "Regulating the practice of professional engineering; providing for the registration of professional engineers; fixing fees and penalties; repealing conflicting laws, and declaring an emergency." This law established the "State Board of Registration for Professional Engineers." It was the origin of the Statutes and Administrative Rules that those of us who are Licensed Professional Engineers follow to this day as regulated by our current State Board of Licensure for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors.

On November 30, 1936, the State Board of Registration for Professional Engineers published their First Annual Report "embodying its transactions to date." They were very busy that first year, to say the least. After having their Board appointed by the Governor, they went right to work with their first meeting on July 17th, 1935. They appointed a Chairman and Secretary, secured office equipment and supplies, opened accounts with the State Treasurer and established a mailing address, all to set themselves up to begin receiving and processing applications for engineers to be registered. At their 2nd meeting, they adopted By-Laws governing registration and developed application forms. Great interest was shown by the engineers of the State and by their 3rd meeting, just three months after their inception, they had one hundred and sixty-five (165) applications. After review and investigation, the Board passed 111 Professional Engineers in this first wave. November 13th, 1935 was the date set by the Statute where no one could legally practice engineering without being registered and this caused a rush of applications to come in. As of November 9th, 1935 they were up to 369 applications, and by November 16th it was up to 712!

The Board was inundated with work with each member individually reading and rating each application, with its supporting records, and some applicants even being called in for questioning. Some applicants appeared with counsel, and at times, the Board called upon the State Attorney General for aid, to which written opinions were provided. The mass of applications in 1935 and continuing through to the end of their fiscal year in November 1936 resulted in a total of 855 total applications from which 713 applicants were registered, 132 applications were rejected, and 10 were still pending by the time of the annual report. The Governor issued a certificate of Registration to each Board member bringing the total up to



718, but with 4 deaths that first year and 10 registrations already revoked, the official number of Professional Engineers registered in the State at the time of the first annual report, after 15 meetings of the Board, was 704.

Registration numbers issued were in numerical order, as they still are today. Mine number, which I received in January 2000, is PE #19561. As a bit of trivia, Geo. J. Stein, the original Chairman of the Board of Registration for Professional Engineers, received PE #1 with his address listed only as "1st Nat'l Bank Bldg, Miami." Their first annual report gives the full list of all 704. I've provided that report on our ASHRAE Central Oklahoma Chapter website on our About Us/History page (<https://ashraecok.org/History>) under the Recent Newsletter Articles section. It's interesting to look through the names and see if any of them are recognizable today. Our Chapter founder, Frank X. Loeffler, at 1604 NW 5th St, Oklahoma City, is listed as PE #125. My first job out of college was with The Benham Group and I noticed Webster L. Benham on the list with PE #11. He founded his engineering firm in 1909 so having been in business already for 26 years when this law went into effect, you know he had his application in as soon as possible when he read that the State would no longer allow him to practice without being registered.

**STATUTE REGULATING
PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERING**

ARTICLE 22, CHAP. 24, OKLAHOMA SESSION LAWS 1935
AN ACT regulating the practice of professional engineering;
providing for the registration of professional engineers;
fixing fees and penalties; repealing conflicting laws, and
declaring an emergency.

Section 1. Professional Engineers—Registration.

In order to safeguard life, health and property, any person practicing or offering to practice professional engineering in this state shall hereafter be required to submit evidence that he or she is qualified so to practice and shall be registered as hereinafter provided, and from and after six (6) months after this Act goes into effect, it shall be unlawful for any person to practice or offer to practice professional engineering in this state unless such person has been duly registered under the provisions of this Act, or has been exempted from registration as hereinafter provided.

Section 2. Definitions

The term "Professional Engineer" as used in this Act shall mean a person who, by reason of his knowledge of mathematics, the physical sciences, and the principles of engineering, acquired by professional education and/or practical experience, is qualified to engage in engineering practice as hereinafter defined. The practice of professional engineering within the meaning and intent of this Act includes any professional engineering service, such as consultation (sic), investigation, evaluation, planning, design or responsible supervision of construction or operation in connection with any public or private utilities, structures, buildings, machines, equipment, processes, works, or projects, wherein the public welfare, or the safeguarding of life health or property is concerned or involved, when such professional engineering service requires the application of engineering principles and data, provided that the term "professional engineering service" as defined in this Section shall not be construed to include the occupation of an "architect" as defined in Section 4422, Oklahoma Statutes, 1931.

Section 3. State Board of Registration

To carry out the provisions of this Act, there is hereby created a State Board of Registration for Professional Engineers, herein called the "Board." The Board shall consist of five (5) registered professional engineers, who shall be appointed by the Governor and shall have the qualifications required by Section 5. The members of the first Board shall be

appointed within sixty (60) days after the passage of this Act, to serve for the following terms: One (1) member for one (1) year, one (1) member for two (2) years, and one (1) member for three (3) years, one (1) member for four (4) years, and one (1) member for five (5) years, from the date of their appointment, or until their successors are duly appointed and qualified. On the expiration of the term of any member, the Governor shall appoint for a term of five (5) years a registered professional engineer, having the qualifications required by Section 4, to take the place of the member whose term on said board is about to expire. Each member shall hold office until the expiration of the term for which such member is appointed, or until a successor shall have been duly appointed and shall have qualified. The Governor may remove any member of the Board for misconduct, incompetency, neglect of duty, or for any other sufficient cause. Vacancies in the membership of the Board shall be filled by appointment by the Governor for the unexpired term.

Section 4. Qualifications of Board Members

Each member of the Board shall be a citizen of the United States, at least thirty-five (35) years of age and shall have been a resident of the State of Oklahoma for at least five (5) years at the time of his appointment. Each member shall have been engaged in the practice of his profession at least ten (10) years and shall have been in responsible charge of work for at least five (5) years. Each member of the Board shall be reimbursed for all necessary traveling, incidental and/or clerical expenses incurred in carrying out the provisions of this Act, and no part of the expenses of the Board shall be paid except from funds procured in administration of this Act as hereinafter provided.

Section 5. Certificate of Registration

Each member of the first Board shall receive, at the time of his appointment, a certificate of registration as a "Professional Engineer" from the Governor of the State. Each member of the Board, when appointed, shall receive a certificate of appointment from the Governor, and before entering upon the duties of the Board, shall take and subscribe to the oath required, which shall be filed with the Secretary of State. The Attorney General of the State shall be the legal advisor of the Board.

Section 6. Board Meetings—Officers

The Board first appointed shall hold a meeting within thirty (30) days after its appointment, and shall organize by the election of one (1) of its members as Chairman, and an-

nually thereafter shall elect from its members a Chairman. The Board shall hold at least two (2) meetings each year and such special meetings as may be provided for in its by-laws or as a majority of the members may desire. The Board shall appoint a Secretary, who shall hold office during its pleasure. A quorum of the Board shall consist of four members.

Section 7. Powers of Board

In carrying into effect the provisions of this Act, the Board may, under the hand of its Chairman and the seal of the Board, subpoena witnesses and compel their attendance, and also may require the production of books, papers, documents, etc. Any member of the Board may administer oaths or affirmations to witnesses appearing before the Board. If any person shall refuse to obey any subpoena so issued, or shall refuse to testify or produce any books, papers, or documents, the Board may present its petition to the District Court of the county in which it may be in session, setting forth the facts, and thereupon such Court shall, in a proper case, issue its subpoena to such person, requiring him or her to appear before such Court and to testify and/or to produce such books, papers, and documents, as may be deemed necessary and pertinent by the Board. Any person failing or refusing to obey the subpoena or order of the said court may be proceeded against in the same manner as for refusal to obey any other subpoena or order of the Court.

Section 8. Seal—Rules—By-Laws

The Board shall adopt and have an official seal. The Board shall have power to make all the by-laws and rules, not inconsistent with the Constitution and laws of this State, which may reasonably be necessary for the proper performance of its duties, and the regulation of the proceedings before it.

Section 9. Secretary—Duties

The Secretary of the Board shall receive and account for all money derived under the provisions of this Act, and shall pay the same monthly to the State Treasurer, who shall keep such money in a separate fund, to be known as the "Professional Engineers Fund." Such funds shall be kept separate and apart from all other money in the State Treasury, and shall be paid out only by warrant of the State Auditor upon the State Treasurer, upon itemized vouchers approved by the Chairman and attested by the Secretary of the Board. Provided that the Board shall pay into the General Fund of the State ten per cent of all such funds collected and received by them at the end of each fiscal year. All other money in the "Professional Engineer's Fund" is hereby specifically appropri-

ated for the use of the Board. The Secretary of the Board shall give a surety bond to this State in such sum as the Board may determine. The premium on said bond shall be regarded as a proper and necessary expense of the Board, and shall be paid out of the "Professional Engineers' Fund." The Secretary of the Board shall receive such salary as the Board shall determine. The Board may employ such other clerical assistance as may be necessary for the proper performance of its work. The books, records, and files of said board shall be in form as prescribed by the State Examiner and Inspector, and at the end of each fiscal year same shall be audited by him and copies of said audit filed in the office of the Secretary of State and with the Governor.

Section 10. Records

The board shall keep a record of its proceedings, and a register of all applications for registration, which register shall show (a) the name, age and residence of each applicant; (b) the date of the application; (c) the place of business of such applicant; (d) his educational and other qualifications; (e) whether or not an examination was required; (f) whether the applicant was rejected; (g) whether a certificate of registration was granted; (h) the date of action of the Board; and (i) such other information as may be deemed necessary by the Board.

Section 11. Roster of Members

A roster showing the name, place of business, and the residence of each professional engineer registered shall be prepared by the Secretary of the Board during the month of November of each year commencing one (1) year from the date this law becomes effective. Copies of this roster shall be obtainable by each person so registered, and a copy of same shall be placed on file by the clerk of each county. Copies of this roster shall be available to any citizen upon request to the Secretary of the Board. Annually as of November 30th, the Board shall submit to the Governor a report of its transactions of the preceding year, and shall also transmit to him a complete statement of the receipts and expenditures of the Board, attested by affidavit of its Chairman and Secretary. Such statement of receipts and expenditures shall be subject to audit by the State Examiner and Inspector.

Section 12. Fees

The Board, upon application on the form prescribed by it, and upon the payment of a fee of Twenty-Five (\$25.00) Dollars, and except as hereinafter provided, shall issue a certificate of registration as a professional engineer to any person

who submits evidence satisfactory to the Board that he or she is qualified to practice professional engineering. Provided, that no person shall be eligible for registration as a professional engineer who is not at least twenty-five (25) years of age, or who is not of good character and repute or who has not been actively engaged for at least eight (8) years in professional engineering, which professional experiences are to be of a character satisfactory to the Board; however, each year of the study of engineering in a school or college satisfactory to the Board shall be considered the equivalent of one (1) year's active practice, but the total number of years of study which may be credited to such eight (8) years of active practice shall not exceed four (4) years; except that graduation from an engineering school or college of recognized high standing satisfactory to the Board shall be deemed equivalent to five (5) years of active practice.

Section 13. Evidence of Qualifications

Unless disqualifying evidence exists, the following facts, established in the application, upon verification by the Board shall be regarded as evidence satisfactory to the Board, that the applicant is qualified to practice, as a professional engineer, to-wit:

(a) A specific record of eight (8) years, or more, of active engagement in engineering work of a character satisfactory to the Board, or

(b) Graduation from a school or college approved by the Board as of satisfactory standing, having a course in engineering of not less than four (4) years, and a specific record of an additional three (3) years of active engagement in engineering work, of a character satisfactory to the Board.

Section 14. Same.

Applicants for registration, in cases where the evidence presented in the application does not appear to the Board conclusive nor warranting the issuing of a certificate of registration, may be required to present, for the consideration of the Board, further evidence, and may also be required to pass an oral or written examination, or both, as the Board may determine. A majority vote of the members of the Board shall be required to pass upon the qualifications of the applicant for registration. When a certificate of registration is issued authorizing the applicant to practice as a professional engineer, the Board shall impress upon each such certificate the seal of the Board.

Section 15. Fees

At any time within six (6) months after this Act goes into effect, upon due application therefor and the payment of a fee of Twenty-Five (\$25.00) Dollars, the Board shall issue a certificate of registration as a professional engineer to any person who shall submit, under oath, evidence satisfactory to the Board that he has been a resident of the State of Oklahoma for at least one (1) year immediately preceding the date of his application and that he was practicing professional engineering in Oklahoma at the time this Act became effective. At any time within six (6) months after this Act goes into effect, upon due application therefor and the payment of a fee of Five (\$5.00) Dollars, the Board shall issue a certificate of registration as a professional engineer to any person to whom has been issued a certificate of competency in accordance with the provisions of Section 7815, Oklahoma Statutes, 1931.

Section 16. Firms or Corporations May Practice

A firm, co-partnership, corporation, or a political subdivision of the State of Oklahoma, may engage in the practice of professional engineering in this State only provided such practice is carried on under the immediate responsible direction of at least one (1) registered professional engineer whose name and seal shall appear on all plans and other official documents issued in connection with such professional engineering practice.

Section 17. Exemptions

The following shall be exempted from registration under the provisions of this Act, to-wit:

(a) A person offering to practice in this State as a professional engineer who is not a resident of, and having no established place of business in this State, provided such person shall have satisfied the Board as herein provided and secured a certificate of registration before entering into any contract to perform any such services or rendering such services;

(b) A person practicing professional engineering solely as an employee or subordinate of a registered professional engineer, which person is not in direct responsible charge of consultation, investigation, evaluation, planning, design or responsible supervision as provided in Section 2 hereof;

(c) A person practicing professional engineering solely in the capacity of an officer or employee of the

Government of the United States or of the State of Oklahoma;

(d) A person practicing professional engineering while a full time employee of a public service corporation and while doing work as a professional engineer solely for said corporation and not for any other public or private interests, provided that the business of said corporation is regulated by the Corporation Commission of the State of Oklahoma.

Section 18. Reciprocal Registration

The Board shall, on application therefor and the payment of a fee of Twenty-Five (\$25.00) Dollars, issue a certificate of registration to any person who holds an unexpired certificate of registration issued to him by the proper authority in that State or territory of the United States in which he is a resident citizen and in which State or territory the requirements for the registration of professional engineers are of a standard satisfactory to the Board; provided, however, that the Engineering Registration Board of said State or territory shall grant full and equal reciprocal registration rights and privileges to registrants of this Board.

Section 19. Annual Fees

Every professional engineer registered under this Act who desires to continue the practice of his profession shall annually pay to the Secretary of the Board a fee of Five (\$5.00) Dollars on or before a date to be fixed by the Board, for which fee a renewal certificate of registration for the current year shall be issued. Certificates of registration revoked for failure to pay renewal fee may be reinstated under rules and regulations of the Board, it being in the discretion of the Board to require examination. The period of delinquency in payment of renewals at the conclusion of which a certificate may be revoked for non-payment shall be determined by the Board and made part of its rules and regulations.

Section 20. Revocation of Certificates

The Board shall have the power to revoke the certification of registration of any registrant, who is found guilty of:

- (a) The practice of any fraud or deceit in obtaining a certificate of registration, or
- (b) Any gross negligence, incompetency or misconduct in the practice of professional engineering as a registered professional engineer.

Any person may prefer, against any registrant, charges of fraud, deceit, negligence, incompetency, or misconduct. Such charges shall be in writing, and shall be sworn to by the person making them and shall be filed with the Secretary of the Board. All charges unless dismissed by the Board as unfounded or trivial, shall be heard by the Board within three months after the date on which they shall have been preferred. The time and place for said hearing shall be fixed by the Board, and a copy of the charges, together with a notice of the time and place of hearing, shall be personally served on or mailed to the last known address of such registrant, at least thirty days before the date fixed for the hearing. At any hearing, the accused registrant shall have the right to appear personally and by counsel, to cross-examine witnesses appearing against him or her, and to produce evidence and witnesses in his own or her own behalf. If, after such hearing, three or more members of the Board vote in favor of finding the accused guilty of such offense as to justify revocation of certificate as herein provided, the Board shall revoke the certificate of registration of such registered professional engineer.

Section 21. Appeals

Any registrant who shall feel aggrieved by any action of the Board in revoking a certificate of registration may appeal therefrom to the District Court of the county wherein the cause of action arose, and, after full hearing, said Court shall make such decree either sustaining the action of the Board or reinstating the certificate of registration of such registrant, as it may seem just and proper.

Section 22. Rights and Privileges

The issuance of a certificate of registration by the Board shall be evidence that the person named therein is entitled to all the rights and privileges of a registered professional engineer, while the said certificate remains unrevoked or unexpired. Each registrant hereunder shall, upon registration, obtain a seal of the design authorized by the Board, bearing the registrant's name and the legend "Registered Professional Engineer." No plans, specifications, plats, and reports issued by a registrant, shall be official unless sealed with his or her seal. It shall be unlawful for any person to seal any documents if the certificate of the registrant named therein has expired or has been revoked.

Section 23. Duplicate Certificates

A new certificate of registration, to replace any certificate revoked, lost, destroyed, or mutilated, shall be issued subject to the rules and regulations of the Board.

Section 24. Practicing Without License

Any person required by this Act to become a registered professional engineer who shall, after six months from the effective date of this Act, practice or offer to practice professional engineering in this State without being so registered, or any person presenting or attempting to use as his own the certificate of registration of another, or any person who shall falsely impersonate any other registrant of like or different name or any person who shall wilfully use or attempt to use a revoked certificate of registration, shall be guilty of misdemeanor, and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars or more than Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars, or be imprisoned for a period not exceeding ninety (90) days or both.

Section 25. Repeal

All Acts and parts of Acts in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 26. Construction of Act

If in the future any section or part of this Act shall be declared unconstitutional such declaration shall affect only that particular section or part of said Act as declared unconstitutional, and shall in no way affect the remaining provisions of this Act.

Section 27. Emergency

It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this Act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

BY-LAWS
STATE BOARD OF REGISTRATION FOR
PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS

1. Name

This board, being State Department No. 113, constituted under the provisions of Article 22, Chapter 24, Oklahoma Session Laws 1935, shall be known as the State Board of Registration For Professional Engineers and shall, hereinafter, be referred to as the "Board."

2. Headquarters

The headquarters of the Board shall be at Oklahoma City.

3. Membership and Qualifications

Membership of the Board and qualifications of the members are prescribed in Section 3, 4 and 5 of the Statute cited.

4. Organization

Beginning with the regular stated meeting in July, 1935, and annually thereafter, the Board shall meet and organize by the election, from its members, of a Chairman.

The Chairman shall be the executive officer of the Board. When present, he shall preside at all meetings. He shall appoint such committees as the Board may authorize from time to time. He shall sign all certificates and other official documents. He shall perform all other duties usually pertaining to the office of Chairman and permitted by law.

In the absence of the Chairman from a regular or special meeting of the Board, the remaining members shall elect a Presiding Officer, who shall serve until the conclusion of the meeting or until the arrival of the Chairman.

The Board shall appoint a Secretary, who shall not be a member of the Board but who shall be a registered professional engineer. The Secretary shall be paid such salary as the Board may direct. Necessary expenses incurred by the Secretary in traveling within the State in performance of his official duties shall be paid on vouchers (claims) handled as prescribed herein and by law. The Secretary shall furnish the necessary office space required for his work, at his own expense. The Board shall furnish the Secretary the necessary equipment, supplies and stenographic assistance, paying for same directly on vouchers (claims) handled as prescribed

herein and by law.

The Secretary shall conduct and care for all correspondence in the name of the Board. He shall maintain all records prescribed by law in accordance with the instructions of the State Examiner and Inspector. He shall keep a record of all meetings and maintain a proper account of all business of the Board. He shall be custodian of the official seal and shall affix same to all certificates and other official documents upon order of the Chairman and/or of the Board. He shall check and certify all bills and check all vouchers (claims) and shall prepare same for approval by the Chairman. During the month of November, 1936, and annually thereafter, he shall prepare a roster of professional engineers registered by this Board, as of November 1st. As of November 30th, 1936, and annually thereafter, he shall prepare a report of the Board for submission to the Governor, covering the transactions of the preceding fiscal year and including a complete statement of the receipts and expenditures of the Board. He shall arrange for audits by the State Examiner and Inspector as required by law. He shall furnish surety bond to the State of Oklahoma in the amount required by the Board, said bond to be filed with the Secretary of State.

5. Vacancies

If, for any reason, a vacancy shall occur in the Board, the Chairman shall call a special meeting for the purpose of preparing a notice to the Governor asking for the appointment of a new member to fill the unexpired term. If the vacancy shall occur in the office of the Chairman, the Secretary shall call the meeting. In such case, the Board shall elect, from its own membership, at the first regular or special meeting following the special meeting provided for herein, a new Chairman to serve for the balance of the unexpired term.

6. Meetings

Two stated regular meetings shall be held each year, one on the third Wednesday in each July and the other on the third Wednesday in each January, at Oklahoma City. The exact time and place of each meeting shall be determined by the Chairman and shall be set forth in a written notice, copy of which shall be mailed to each member at his last address of record, by the Secretary at least ten days in advance of the date of the meeting.

Special meetings may be called at any time by order of the Chairman and shall be called by the Secretary on the written request of any three members of the Board. Notice as prescribed above or telegraphic notice not less than seventy-two (72) hours in advance of the date and time of the meeting,

shall be given each member by the Secretary, said notice setting forth the exact time and place of the meeting as determined by the person issuing the call.

Four members of the Board shall constitute a quorum at any meeting.

7. Fiscal Year

The fiscal year of the Board shall begin July 1st and close June 30th of each year.

8. Seal

The seal of the Board shall be an embossed circular seal, 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ " in diameter, consisting of two concentric circles. The inner circle shall be 1 $\frac{3}{8}$ " in diameter and shall contain the great seal of the State of Oklahoma. The outer circle shall be 2 $\frac{1}{8}$ " in diameter and the area between the two circles shall contain the wording "State Board of Registration for Professional Engineers" and the word "Oklahoma".

9. Order of Business

The order of business at all regular and special meetings of the Board shall be as follows

1. Roll call.
2. Reading of minutes.
3. Report of committees.
4. Report of Secretary and reading of communications.
5. Unfinished business.
6. New business.
7. Reading and consideration of applications.
8. Examination of applicants.
9. Adjournment.

10. Procedure

"Roberts' Rules of Order" shall govern the proceedings of the Board except as otherwise provided herein or by statute.

11. Registration

Applications received by the Board shall be examined by the Secretary for conformity with the Rules and Regulations governing applications as established by the Board. Applications accompanied by proper fees and in the form prescribed shall be entered in the records of the Board. Applications not accompanied by proper fees or not conforming entirely to the Rules and Regulations shall be returned to the applicant, with instructions as to the correction thereof.

When applications accompanied by proper fees are accepted by the Secretary and entered in the books of the Board, the Secretary shall proceed to correspond with the references cited in the respective applications, in the manner prescribed

by the Board. If replies from the references cited are not received within a reasonable time, the Secretary shall notify the applicant to that effect, requesting additional references. The Secretary shall correspond with such additional references. If an application be based on the reciprocity provisions of the Statute cited, the Secretary shall secure from the examining board by which the certificate of registration involved was issued, complete information as to the basis for the issuance of said certificate, provided, however, that if the certificate, offered be a certificate of registration from the National Bureau of Engineering Registration operated by the National Council of State Board of Engineering Examiners and if said certificate bear as an indorsement thereon proper authentication by the authorized official of the State Board of engineering registration of that state in which the holder of the certificate is a resident citizen, such inquiry may be omitted. When all necessary information has been brought together with regard to a given application, the application with all incidental papers shall be brought to the attention of the Board at the first subsequent meeting.

12. Financial

The Board shall maintain two accounts with the State Treasurer. Account Number One shall be known as the Professional Engineers Fund, provided for in the Statute cited. Account Number Two shall be known as the Depository Account.

Registration or reinstatement fees accepted with applications shall be deposited by the Secretary in the Depository Account, to be held in trust for the applicants until final disposition of the respective applications is made by the Board. When a certificate is granted or reinstated on any given application, the corresponding fee shall become the property of the Board and shall be transferred from the Depository Account at the first subsequent transfer period, ten (10) per cent thereof being paid into the General Fund and the remaining ninety (90) per cent being paid into the Professional Engineers Fund. All other fees or monies received by the Board in the administration of the Statute cited shall be deposited in the Depository Account and shall be transferred to the General Fund and to the Professional Engineers Fund in similar proportions and at the first subsequent transfer period. Such transfers shall be made on vouchers signed by the Secretary. In each case where a certificate of registration or the reinstatement thereof is finally refused a given applicant, the Board, by motion spread in its minutes, shall order the refund to the applicant of the amount of the fee which had been paid to and accepted by the Board. Such refunds shall be made by voucher drawn on the Depository Account, signed by the Chairman

and attested by the Secretary.

Payment of all salaries and other operating expenses of the Board shall be made by itemized vouchers (claims) on the Professional Engineers Fund. Such vouchers (claims) shall be approved by the Chairman of the Board and attested by the Secretary.

The Secretary shall issue proper receipts for all payments made to and accepted by the Board and shall maintain complete records of financial transactions of the Board, as prescribed by the State Examiner and Inspector.

13. Rules and Regulations

The Board shall promulgate and adopt two sets of rules and regulations. One set shall prescribe the detailed procedure governing the filing of applications, the examination and registration of applicants, annual renewals, revocation of registration for non-renewal, re-instatement of former registrants and other matter pertinent thereto. The other set shall prescribe detailed procedure for the filing of charges against registrants under the general provisions of the Statute cited, for the hearing of such charges and for the revocation of certificates resulting therefrom. These rules and regulations shall be spread upon the minutes of the Board for the meeting at which they are adopted.

Amendments to the rules and regulations may be proposed by any member of the Board and shall be filed with the Secretary. A copy of the proposed amendments shall be furnished each member at the time of notice of the next regular or special meeting. The amendments so proposed shall be voted upon at the meeting immediately thereafter. Four (4) votes shall be required for the adoption of an amendment.

14. National Council

The Board shall affiliate with the National Council of State Boards of Engineering Examiners. The Secretary shall be, ex-officio, the Delegate of the Board to the Council. He shall attend each annual meeting of the Council at his own expense and shall pay such other expenses in connection with the affiliation of the Board.

15. Amendments.

Amendments to these By-Laws may be proposed by any member of the Board and shall be filed with the Secretary. Copy of the proposed amendments shall be furnished each member at the time of notice of the next regular or special meeting. The amendments so proposed shall be voted upon at the meeting immediately thereafter. Four (4) votes shall be required for the adoption of an amendment.

**RULES AND REGULATIONS
GOVERNING REGISTRATION
STATE BOARD OF REGISTRATION FOR
PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS**

Rule 1. Classification of Applicants

For convenience in handling application for registration under the provisions of Article 22, Chapter 24, Oklahoma Session Laws 1935, there are hereby established four classes of applicants:

CLASS A. This class shall include applicants for registration under the provisions of Sections 12, 13 and 14;

CLASS B. This class shall include applicants for registration under the provisions of Section 18;

CLASS C. This class shall include applicants for registration under the provisions of Section 15, on the grounds that the applicant was practicing professional engineering in Oklahoma at the time this Act became effective (May 13, 1935). This is a temporary class. Applications under this classification will not be accepted after November 13, 1935;

CLASS D. This class shall include applicants for registration under the provisions of Section 15, on the grounds that the applicant has been issued a certificate of competency in accordance with the provisions of Section 7815, Oklahoma Statutes, 1931. This is a temporary class. Applications under this classification will not be accepted after November 13, 1935.

Rule 2. Class A Applicants

Class A applicants will be required to submit the following information:

Name; usual written signature; photograph; residence address; business address; date and place of birth; occupation; membership in technical and professional societies; complete record of education; complete record of engineering experience. The last item shall be concise but comprehensive and shall contain full details of each commitment or employment cited, including names and addresses of clients or employers, nature, scope and location of projects, degree of responsibility and authority exercised and all other matter necessary to the formation of a proper opinion by the Board as to the applicability of the experience cited. The applicant will also be required to furnish the names and addresses of at least five people who are not related to the applicant, either by blood or marriage, who are not members or employees of this Board

and who are familiar with various periods of the applicant's engineering experience. At least three of the references cited must be engineers.

Rule 3. Class B Applicants

Class B applicants will be required to submit the following information:

Name; usual written signature; photograph; residence address; business address; date and place of birth; occupation; a photostatic copy of an unexpired certificate of registration issued to the applicant by the proper authority in that State or territory of the United States of which he is a resident citizen.

Rule 4. Class C Applicants

Class C applications cannot be accepted after November 13, 1935.

Rule 5. Class D Applicants

Class D applications cannot be accepted after November 13, 1935.

Rule 6. Form of Application

All applications shall be made on printed forms furnished by the Board. All information filled in on these forms must be typewritten. In case there is not sufficient room on the form to present all the subject matter necessary, the applicant shall set forth the additional information on additional sheets of plain white paper, 8½"x11" in size. Such sheets shall be typewritten on one side only, shall be marked and numbered consecutively and in series with the regular pages of the application. The extra pages shall accompany the application and may be bound to it with paper clips or similar temporary binding, but shall not be stapled or otherwise permanently bound thereto.

Rule 7. Affidavit

An affidavit shall constitute a part of each application and the page bearing same shall be the last page of the application and shall be numbered accordingly. The affidavit shall be acknowledged before a Notary Public or other authorized officer.

Rule 8. Fees

Each application for registration shall be accompanied by a registration fee in the sum of Twenty-five (25) Dollars as provided in the statute cited. Each application for reinstatement shall be accompanied by the proper reinstatement fee as provided in Rule 19 thereof. Any application not so

accompanied will be returned to the applicant. Remittance shall be made in any convenient form, provided that the Board assumes no responsibility for cash remittances which are not forwarded by registered mail and provided further that applications accompanied by remittance in the form of personal checks will be filed subject to the collection of the item and receipt for the remittance will not be issued until the check has cleared and no action will be taken on the application until the check has cleared.

Registration or reinstatement fees accepted by the Board with applications, will be held in trust by the Board for the respective applicants, pending final disposition by the Board of the applications involved. In cases where certificates of registration are granted, or reinstated, the corresponding fees will become the property of the Board and will be disposed of by the Board as provided by law. In cases where certificates of registration or reinstatement thereof are finally refused by the Board, the fees which accompanied the applications involved will be returned by the Board to the respective applicants.

Rule 9. Examinations

If the Board, in considering the application of a Class A applicant, deems an examination necessary, the examination will be divided into two parts. Part One will cover subject matter of a general engineering education or training. If the applicant is a graduate of a recognized engineering college, Part One may be waived at the discretion of the Board. Part Two will cover that branch of engineering in the practice of which the applicant is engaged, as indicated by his experience record. Where possible, the usually recognized branches will be considered in the preparation of examinations, but the Board reserves the right, where the education and experience of an applicant has been in a highly specialized field, to narrow or extend the limits of an examination in a reasonable manner. Examinations, whether written or oral or both, will be held at such time and place as the Board may designate. Applicants of whom examinations are required will be notified to that effect at least thirty days in advance.

Rule 10. Rejected Applications

If an application is rejected, notification of such action will be sent the applicant promptly, stating the reasons for the rejection. The applicant may then be permitted to submit additional evidence to substantiate his claims for registration and the Board will consider such evidence at its earliest convenience. If rejection was due to the failure of the applicant to pass examinations to which he was subjected, the applicant may apply for re-examination at any time after six months after the date of the rejection, in which case re-examination

will be granted at the earliest convenience of the Board. If, after re-examination, registration is again refused by the Board, the particular case will be considered as closed. The unsuccessful applicant, in order to receive further consideration, may do so only by filing a new application, accompanied by the proper fee, at a later date.

Rule 11. Language

All application forms and information furnished thereon and all examinations and answers thereto shall be entirely in the English language.

Rule 12. Disposal of Applications

When the Board, after due consideration of an application and of information pertaining thereto is satisfied that the applicant is eligible for registration, the applicant will be registered. The applicant will be notified of this action by the Secretary.

Rule 13. Registration Number

At the time an applicant is ordered registered by the Board, he will be assigned a registration number. These numbers will be issued consecutively in the order in which the applications are approved by the Board. The applicant will be advised of his registration number in the notice sent him by the Secretary. He will also be instructed to secure a seal of the type specified by the Board and bearing his name and registration number. As soon as the registrant has secured his seal, he shall make an imprint thereof on a form to be furnished by the Board and shall return same to the Board for its files. A registration number which has once been issued to a registrant will become obsolete in the event of the revocation of said registration or of the death of the registrant. If a former registrant is reinstated, he will be re-issued his original number. If a former registrant is registered anew by virtue of a new application, he will be issued a new registration number. Registration numbers which have become obsolete will not be reissued to any registrant other than the original holder thereof.

Rule 14. Seal

The seal to be used by a registrant of this Board shall be a circular embossed metal seal; the use of a rubber stamp or drawn or lettered form in lieu thereof being specifically not authorized by the Board. The design of the seal shall consist of two concentric circles. The inner circle shall contain the name of the registrant, worded and spelled exactly as it appears on his certificate, and his registration number; no

other wording, lettering, or design shall appear therein. The area between the two circles shall contain the word "Oklahoma" at the bottom and reading counter-clockwise. In the balance of this area shall be inserted the words "Registered Professional Engineer" reading clockwise.

Seals of two different sizes will be acceptable. The seal commercially designated as a 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " seal and having an inner circle approximately 1 $\frac{1}{8}$ " in diameter and an outer circle approximately 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " in diameter is acceptable and is to be preferred for desk type seals. The seal commercially designated as a 1 $\frac{3}{8}$ " seal and having an inner circle approximately 1 1-16" in diameter and an outer circle approximately 1 9-16" in diameter is also acceptable and is to be preferred for pocket type seals.

Rule 15. Certificates of Registration

As soon as possible after the Board has received the imprint of the seal from an applicant who has been notified of the approval of his application and of his registration number, a certificate of registration will be issued, signed by the Chairman and by the Secretary and bearing the seal of the Board, and also bearing on its face the registration number of the applicant.

Rule 16. Applicants from States not Providing for Reciprocal Registration Privileges

Applicants who are legal residents of States which do not have engineering registration laws or from States, the registration laws of which do not provide for reciprocal privileges, may be registered in this State only on the basis of Class A applications. If at any time, any State shall repeal its registration law or withdraw the reciprocal registration privileges of Oklahoma registrants, all registrations under Section 18 of this Act and based on certificates of registration from the State in question, may be revoked by action of the Board.

Rule 17. Renewals

Each Certificate of Registration shall expire on the last day of June following its issuance or renewal, and shall become invalid on that date unless renewed. In this connection, the attention of registrants is directed to that portion of Section 22 of the Statute cited reading as follows: "It shall be unlawful for any person to seal any documents if the certificate of the registrant named therein has expired or has been revoked." As of June 1st of each year the Secretary of the Board will mail to each registrant, at his mailing address as recorded in the records of the Board, notice of expiration. Each regis-

trant desiring to continue the practice of his profession shall renew his certificate prior to the last day of June by paying to the Secretary of the Board a fee of \$5.00, in return for which the Board will issue a renewal certificate for the ensuing year. Expired certificates may be reinstated at any time up to and including October 31st of the year of their expiration by payment of the prescribed fee. All certificates which have not been renewed or reinstated by midnight of October 31st of any year shall be revoked automatically as of October 31st and the names of such registrants shall not appear in the roster issued annually as of November 1st.

As of October 1st of each year, the Secretary of the Board will mail to each registrant who has failed to renew his certificate prior to the last day of June of the same year and who has failed to reinstate same subsequently, at his mailing address as recorded in the records of the Board, notice that his certificate will be revoked automatically as of October 31st unless reinstated prior thereto.

Rule 18. Revocation of Certificates of Registration

Under the Statute cited certificates may be revoked by the Board for non-payment of renewal fees as provided in the previous rule, and for cause after proper hearing as provided in Section 20. Separate rules and regulations are issued by the Board covering the preference of charges and the hearing of same and the revocation of certificates resulting therefrom.

Rule 19. Reinstatement of Certificates Revoked for Failure to Pay Renewal Fee

Former registrants whose certificates were revoked for failure to pay renewal fees and who shall desire to reinstate same, shall make application for reinstatement on the basis prescribed below. For convenience in handling applications for reinstatement there are hereby established three classes thereof:

Class 1. This class shall include applicants for reinstatement whose original applications for registration were made under the provisions of Class A, Rule 1. The certificate of such an applicant will be reinstated on his simple application therefor on a form prescribed by the Board and accompanied by remittance equal to the total amount of money which would have been paid to the Board in renewal fees up to the time of application, had the original certificate not been permitted to expire, plus an additional fee of \$2.00 to reimburse the Board for the expense of the special handling required by this procedure, and provided further that if the amount of the remittance computed as described above, shall exceed \$25.00,

the applicant may file for registration as though he had not previously been registered. In such a case the fact of the revocation of his previous certificate shall not be considered against the applicant in the consideration of any application he may make.

Class 2. This class shall include applicants for reinstatement whose original applications for registration were made under the provisions of Class B, Rule 1. If such an applicant is, at the time of his application, a resident of that State which had granted him the original registration on which his registration in this State was based, and if his registration in said State is not expired and is in good standing at the time of his application for reinstatement and if the State in question still extends to the registrants of this Board the same reciprocal privileges that were extended at the time of the applicant's original registration in this State, he will be reinstated on his simple application therefor on a form prescribed by the Board, accompanied by remittance equal to the total amount of money which would have been paid to the Board in renewal fees up to the time of application, had the original certificate not been permitted to expire, plus an additional fee of \$2.00 to reimburse the Board for the expense of the special handling required by this procedure, and provided further that if the amount of the remittance computed as described above, shall exceed \$25.00, the applicant may file for registration as though he had not previously been registered. In such a case the fact of the revocation of his previous certificate shall not be considered against the applicant in the consideration of any application he may make.

Class 3. This class shall include applicants for reinstatement whose original applications for registration were made under the provisions of Class C or Class D, Rule 1. Such an applicant shall make application for reinstatement on a form prescribed by the Board and accompanied by remittance equal to the total amount of money which would have been paid to the Board in renewal fees up to the time of application, had the original certificate not been permitted to expire, plus an additional fee of \$2.00 to reimburse the Board for the expense of the special handling required by this procedure, and provided further that the amount of the remittance computed as described above shall not exceed \$25.00. On the application form prescribed for this class of applicants, an applicant will be required to submit the following information: Name; usual written signature; photograph; residence address, business address; date and place of birth; occupation; membership in technical and professional societies; complete record of education; complete record of engineering experience. The last item shall be concise but comprehensive and shall contain

full details of each commitment or employment cited, including names and addresses of clients or employers, nature, scope and location of projects, degree of responsibility and authority exercised and all other matter necessary to the formation of a proper opinion by the Board as to the applicability of the experience cited. The applicant will also be required to furnish the names and addresses of at least five people who are not related to the applicant, either by blood or marriage, who are not members or employees of this Board and who are familiar with various periods of the applicant's engineering experience. At least three of the references cited must be engineers. If the Board, in considering an application on such form, shall deem an examination necessary, the examination will be given as described in Rule 9 above. If an examination is required of a given applicant and the amount of fee prescribed herein is less than \$25.00, an additional fee of \$10.00 will be required of the applicant, to reimburse the Board for the extra expense of the examination and other procedure required herein, providing that the total amount of the fee charged shall not exceed \$25.00. In such case, the fact of the revocation of his previous certificate shall not be considered against the applicant in the consideration of any application he may make.

Rule 20. New Certificates to Replace Certificates Revoked under the Provisions of Section 20 of the Statute Cited

Former registrants of this Board whose certificates of registration were revoked under the provisions of Section 20 of the Statute cited (revoked for cause) and who shall desire to secure new certificates of registration, shall make application therefor as though they had not been registered before. Such applicants shall have no special status before the Board due to the fact of their former registration. On the other hand, the fact of the revocation of their former certificates and the circumstances attendant thereto shall be considered specifically by the Board, both from the standpoint of competency and of character, in considering any application made hereunder.

Rule 21. Duplicate Certificates

A new certificate of registration to replace any certificate lost, destroyed or mutilated will be issued to any registrant of this Board on his simple application therefor on a form prescribed by the Board, accompanied by a fee in the sum of \$2.00 to reimburse the Board for the expense involved in the issuance thereof.



INFORMATION FOR APPLICANTS AND REGISTRANTS

1. Application forms will be furnished only on request.
2. All communications should be addressed to the Secretary, State Board of Registration for Professional Engineers, Post Office Box 1501, Oklahoma City.
3. Remittances should not be made except in the company of applications or other printed forms furnished by the Board.
4. All registrations, regardless of date issued, expire June 30th of each year, unless renewed on or prior to that date by payment of statutory renewal fee of five dollars (\$5.00).
5. If the renewal is delinquent beyond October 31st, the certificate will be revoked and formal application for reinstatement is necessary.

FIRST ANNUAL REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR

Registration for Professional Engineers became a reality in Oklahoma on May 13, 1935, when House Bill No. 264 of the Fifteenth Oklahoma Legislature, having passed both Houses, was approved by Governor E. W. Marland.

The State Board of Registration for Professional Engineers began to function as such Board on July 17th, 1935, when it held its organization meeting. The following members appointed by the Governor, duly qualified, constituted the Board:

Geo. J. Stein, Miami
Boyd S. Myers, Oklahoma City
J. F. Brookes, Norman
T. P. Clonts, Muskogee
W. C. Roads, Tulsa

Member Geo. J. Stein was elected Chairman for the fiscal year and Wm. Furber Smith was selected as Temporary Secretary. Engr. Smith was later made Secretary and served until January 21, 1936. At this meeting arrangements were made for securing the necessary office equipment and supplies to receive applications. Provisions were made for bonding the Secretary, for opening the required accounts with the State Treasurer, for establishing a permanent mail address (P. O. Box 1501, Oklahoma City), and for such other arrangements as would be necessary to enable the Board to operate.

On September 4, 1935, the Board held its second meeting at which time it adopted the various printed forms required in receiving applications, canvassing references and issuing certificates of registration, etc. The Board also adopted its By-Laws and Rules and Regulations governing registration.

Great interest was shown by the engineers of the State and also of other States, and by October 18th, the date of the Board's third meeting, one hundred and sixty-five (165) applications for registration had been received. Investigation had been completed on a large portion of this number and the Board passed upon them, registering one hundred and eleven (111) Professional Engineers at this meeting.

With November 13th approaching, beyond which date it would no longer be legal to practice or offer to practice Professional Engineering in Oklahoma, applications for registration accumulated with increasing rapidity. As of November 9th, three hundred and sixty-nine (369) applications had been received. November 16th, the number was seven hundred and twelve (712), in one week three hundred and forty-three (343) applications having been received. It can be readily appreciated that the Secretary had plenty to do, and that the Board had many days work before it. This is particularly true when it is realized that each member of the Board, individually read and rated each application and the supporting records relative to the applicant. All of the problems arising from this mass of applications were not cleared until April 18, 1936, the eleventh meeting of the Board, and after thirty-two applicants had had personal hearings before the Board at the various meetings.

From November 15, 1935 to April 30, 1936, an Assistant Secretary was employed. Erle K. Ramsey serving as such from November 15th, 1935 to January 21, 1936, Wm. Furber Smith acting in that capacity from January 21st to April 30, 1936.

Naturally, such a bulk of applications necessitated a great deal of correspondence, and as a matter of course, many border line cases existed which required the determination of salient facts by personal contact by the Secretary or a Board member to establish whether or not the occupation of the

applicant comprised Professional Engineering under the law—and other pertinent facts.

This was particularly true regarding applications under Section 15 of the Act, the Waiver Clause or so-called "Grandfather Clause". Practically no applicants under the Waiver Clause provision were rejected without affording them the opportunity of a hearing. These hearings were not examinations, but were similar to a judicial proceeding for the purpose of determining the facts in a given case relative the applicant's duties and responsibilities which comprised his asserted practice of Professional Engineering. While not an examination, questions might be asked tending to demonstrate the applicant's qualifications or capabilities to perform the engineering services set up in his application. All testimony was under oath and stenographic record was kept. Some applicants were accompanied by counsel, but usually they were not.

Since geology and land surveying were not included in the law, and since architecture was specifically excluded, many border line problems were involved in these subjects. For its own guidance in consideration of cases at hand, the Board has adopted the following definitions and interpretations, to-wit:

"The Petroleum Geologist is primarily engaged in the finding of oil through the application of Geology. His work is not professional engineering within the law.

"The Petroleum Engineer is primarily engaged in the extraction of oil through the application of engineering. His work is within the scope of the law.

"Surveying, when unrelated to investigation, design and construction is not the practice of professional engineering as defined by law, and when related thereto is not necessarily of a satisfactory character depending on the degree of responsibility exercised and the scope, magnitude and importance of the work.

"Valuations for tax purposes are not the practice of professional engineering in the opinion of this Board, for the reason that such valuations are largely formal compliance with Governmental Regulations and tax law and do not necessarily embody the principals of sound economics and engineering required in commercial appraisals."

Under the law the Attorney General of the State is the legal advisor of the Board. As such advisor, he rendered valuable aid in formulating the By-laws and Rules of the Board and setting up formal procedures. From time to time he has been called upon for written opinions interpretative of the law. He has written twelve such opinions in addition to consultation, and representation in litigation. Excerpts from

pertinent opinions concerning the Oklahoma Registration Statute follows:

"The Attorney General acknowledges receipt of your letter of July 5, 1935, wherein you state that the County Commissioners of your County were preparing to appoint a county engineer. In your letter you refer to Section 7815 O. S. 1931, and House Bill No. 264, of the Fifteenth Legislature (Section 298 to 323, inc, Harlow's S. L. 1935), and you ask the following questions:

1. Does House Bill 264 repeal Section 7815, O. S. 1931, in so far as said section requires the county engineer to hold a certificate of competency from the State Highway Commission, and require a certificate of registration as a professional engineer or is it necessary that the county engineer be a registered professional engineer and also hold a certificate of competency from the State Highway Commission?

The answer to the above questions necessitates interpretation of Section 7815, O. S. 1931 and House Bill 264. Your attention is directed to Section 7815, O. S. 1931, which reads in part as follows:

"* * * No person shall be eligible to be employed as County Engineer, or in any engineering capacity, except as an assistant, upon any road, bridge, drainage, irrigation or other work coming under the supervision of the Department of Highways, who does not possess a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Highways of this State * * *

Section 1 of House Bill 264 reads in part as follows:

"* * * and from and after six (6) months after this Act goes into effect, it shall be unlawful for any person to practice or offer to practice professional engineering in this State unless such person has been duly registered under the provisions of this Act, or has been exempted from registration as hereinafter provided."

Section 2 of House Bill 264 defines the practice of Professional Engineering as follows:

"* * * The practice of professional engineering within the meaning and intent of this Act includes any professional engineering service such as consultation (sic), investigation, evaluation, planning, design, or responsible supervision of construction or operation in connection with any public or private utilities, structures, buildings, machines, equipment, processes, works, or projects, wherein the public welfare, or the safeguarding of life, health or property is concerned or involved, when such professional engineering service requires the application of engineering principles and data. * * *

"Section 24 of said House Bill 264 makes any person who

shall after six months from the effective date of said Act practice or offer to practice professional engineering guilty of a misdemeanor. House Bill 264 of the Fifteenth Legislature does not expressly repeal Section 7815, O. S. 1931. It is well settled in Oklahoma that repeals by implication are not favored and that an existing statute is not repealed by a subsequent act unless the provisions of the later act are clearly in conflict with the former act. It is also well settled in Oklahoma that a later statute which is general in its terms and which does not expressly repeal a prior special statute will ordinarily not effect the special provisions of the earlier statute. From an examination of Section 7815, O. S. 1931, it appears that same is special in its nature and that the terms thereof apply especially and only to the qualification of county engineers and does not apply to the practice of engineering generally, while House Bill 264 relates generally to the practice of professional engineering and requires all persons engaged in the practice of such profession to be registered as therein provided. Therefore, it is the opinion of the Attorney General that House Bill 264 does not operate to repeal or amend the provisions of Section 7815, O. S. 1931, relating to the appointment and qualification of county engineers.

"An examination of Section 2 of said House Bill clearly reveals that a person performing the duties of county engineer would be engaged in the practice of professional engineering and in view of the fact that county engineers are not exempted from the operation of said Act, it is the opinion of the Attorney General that the County Engineers must hold a certificate of competency under Section 7815, O. S. 1931, and also be registered as provided in House Bill 264.

"The Attorney General acknowledges receipt of your letter of January 13th, 1936, * * * You inquire, in effect, if it is necessary for the plans relative to water and sewer projects to bear the seal of a licensed engineer.

"Section 6070, O. S. 1931, provides in part as follows:
"That no person, company, corporation, institu-

tion or municipality shall let a contract or contracts for any construction work of any nature for a sanitary sewerage system and sewerage disposal and treatment plant, or for any extensions, either in whole or in part, or place or permit to be placed or discharged or permit to flow into any of the water of the State or elsewhere any sewerage except as hereinafter provided, subsequent to the passage of this act without a written permit from the State Board of Health. An application for such permit shall be made to the State Board of Health and shall be accompanied by a certified copy of the map or maps, plans and specifications for the construction of such sanitary sewerage system, sewerage disposal or treatment plant or extension, together with a complete description of the designs of the system, sewer outfall and disposal or treatment plant, together with all other data and information as may be required by the State Board of Health, all of which data shall be filed of record with the State Board of Health, and no other extension or change of any kind shall be made in the manner of sewerage disposal or treatment without an additional permit being issued by the State Board of Health, which permit may be obtained in a similar manner from the State Board of Health. * * *

"Section 22, Article 22, Chapter 24, Session Laws of 1935, provides as follows:

"The issuance of a certificate of registration by the Board shall be evidence that the person named therein is entitled to all the rights and privileges of a registered professional engineer, while the said certificate remains unrevoked or unexpired. Each registrant hereunder shall, upon registration, obtain a seal of the design authorized by the Board, bearing the registrant's name and the legend "Registered Professional Engineer." No plans, specifications, plats, and reports issued by a registrant, shall be official unless sealed with his or her seal. It shall be unlawful for any person to seal any documents if the certificate of the registrant named therein has expired or has been revoked.

"Since the 1935 Act regulating the practice of professional engineering was enacted for the protection of the public under the police power of the State, and since the drawing up of the plans required to be submitted to your Board under the provisions of Section 6076, supra, is within the definition of "the practice of professional engineering" within the meaning of Section 2, Article 22, Chapter 24, supra, the Attorney General is of the opinion that said plans must bear the seal

of the engineer in order to be official and cognizable by your Board.

"The Attorney General acknowledges receipt of your letter of June 3, 1936 * * * In this connection you ask for an opinion from this office on the following questions:

'(1) Does the inspection of structural materials, purchased by the county for the use of the county highway system constitute the practice of "professional engineering" as defined by Section 2 of the statute cited?

'(2) Does the inspection report made by such an organization constitute an "official document" as referred to in Section 16 of the statute cited; and, if it constitutes a "report" as required in Section 22 thereof, should such "document" or "report" bear the seal of a "registered professional engineer" before it becomes official and cognizable by the Board of County Commissioners?

"In reply thereto, Section 2 of Article 22, Chapter 24, supra, provides:

'The term 'Professional Engineer' as used in this Act shall mean a person who, by reason of his knowledge of mathematics, the physical sciences, and the principles of engineering, acquired, by professional education and/or practical experience, is qualified to engage in engineering practice as hereinafter defined. The practice of professional engineering within the meaning and intent of this Act includes any professional engineering service, such as consultation (sic), investigation, evaluation, planning, design, or responsible supervision of construction or operation in connection with any public or private utilities, structures, buildings, machines, equipment, processes, works, or projects, wherein the public welfare, or the safe-guarding of life, health or property is concerned or involved when such professional engineering service requires the application of engineering principles and data, provided that the term "professional engineering service" as defined in this Section shall not be construed to include the occupation of an "architect" as defined in Section 4422, Oklahoma Statutes, 1931.'

"It is the opinion of the Attorney General that the inspection of structural materials to be used on the county highway system is clearly within the definition of "the practice of professional engineering" within the meaning of the above quoted section. Therefore, your first question is answered in the affirmative.

"Section 16 of Article 22, Chapter 24, supra, provides as follows:

'A firm, co-partnership, corporation, or a political subdivision of the State of Oklahoma, may engage in the practice of professional engineering in this State only provided such practice is carried on under the immediate responsible direction of at least one (1) registered professional engineer whose name and seal shall appear on all plans and other documents issued in connection with such professional engineering practice.'

"Section 22 of said Article provides as follows:

'The issuance of a certificate of registration by the Board shall be evidence that the person named therein is entitled to all the rights and privileges of a registered professional engineer, while the said certificate remains unrevoked or unexpired. Each registrant hereunder shall, upon registration, obtain a seal of the design authorized by the Board, bearing the registrant's name and the legend "Registered Professional Engineer." No plans, specifications, plats and reports issued by a registrant, shall be official unless sealed with his or her seal. It shall be unlawful for any person to seal any documents if the certificate of the registrant named therein has expired or has been revoked.'

"In answer to your second question, it is the opinion of the Attorney General that the inspection report of the structural materials to be used on the county highway system constitutes an "official document" as referred to in Section 16, supra, and also constitutes a "report" as referred to in Section 22, supra, which under the provisions of Section 22, supra, must bear the seal of a "Registered Professional Engineer" in order to be official and cognizable by the Board of County Commissioners.

Under the Statute the Board is not charged with enforcement of the law as regards prosecution of non-registered engineers practicing or offering to practice professional engineering in this State. Such illegal acts, the same as any other violation of law, come within the jurisdiction of the County Attorney's office and other officials charged with enforcement of law.

The jurisdiction of the Board embraces registration only and its duty is to determine whether an applicant for registration shall be granted or denied such registration, and also, where charges have been preferred against a registrant, to sit in judgment and decree whether a certificate of registration be or not be revoked. In discharge of its duties it has endeavored to maintain as its uniform policy an attitude of impartial fairness to all individuals desiring to the State the benefit of any doubts in matters pertaining to registration.

The Board has received a total of eight hundred and fifty-five (855) applications to date, from which number seven hundred and thirteen (713) have resulted in registration, one hundred and thirty-two (132) have been rejected and ten are pending. Seven (7) applicants filed more than one application, and these one hundred thirty-two (132) applications rejected represent one hundred twenty-five (125) rejected applicants. Of those making formal application the second time, four (4) were registered, two (2) again rejected and one (1) pending.

Its work in passing upon this number of applications and transacting the necessary business of the Board has required fifteen (15) meetings approximating twenty-seven (27) days absence from place of residence for most of the Board members. A summary of meetings follows:

In addition to the seven hundred and thirteen (713) registrations issued by the Board, each Board member received a certificate of registration from the Governor at the time of appointment, making a total number of certificates issued seven hundred and eighteen (718) to date. Four (4) deaths and ten revocations of expired certificates have reduced our registrants to seven hundred and four (704).

Renewal of certificates are due June 30th of each year and failure to renew by October 31st revokes the certificate. On June 30, 1936, six hundred and ninety-two (692) registrations required renewal. The loss of ten (10) registrations represents a mortality of less than one and one-half ($1\frac{1}{2}$) per cent from that cause. More than half of these former registrants have moved out of the State to other portions of the country and apparently did not care to keep in effect their Oklahoma registration.

Negotiations are under way with a number of other States for the purpose of entering into reciprocal agreements whereby the registrants of the respective States may be registered in the other State on a reciprocal basis. To date such agreement has been consummated with the State of Ohio and one registration has been granted thereunder. A similar arrangement is being perfected with the Board of the State of Kansas at this time.

At the meeting July 15th, which was a Regular Session, Member Boyd S. Myers was elected Chairman of the Board succeeding Member Geo. J. Stein, whose term of office expired June 30, 1936. Engr. Stein continued to serve as a member of the Board pending the appointment and qualification of his successor, and the Board enters, with unchanged personnel, another year of service devoted to administering the law and raising the standards of the engineering profession for the benefit of public welfare.
